6 PRACTICES ON MAINTAINING A CLEAN AND CLEAR JOBSITE

- ⇒ **Keep Walkways and Work Areas Clear**
 - Remove debris, tools, and materials from pathways.
 - Ensure proper storage of equipment and supplies.
 - Use designated walkways and keep them free from obstructions.
- ⇒ **Proper Waste Disposal**
 - Dispose of scrap materials, packaging, and waste in designated bins.
 - Follow proper hazardous waste disposal guidelines.
 - Keep flammable materials away from ignition sources.
- ⇒ **Organize Tools and Equipment**
 - Store tools properly after use to prevent tripping hazards.
 - Secure heavy tools and equipment to avoid tipping.
 - Label storage areas for quick and easy access.
- ⇒ **Maintain a Clean Work Surface**
 - Sweep and clean work areas regularly.
 - Keep liquids and oils cleaned up to prevent slips.
 - Use anti-slip mats where necessary.
- ⇒ **Ensure Proper Lighting**
 - Replace broken or dim lights to improve visibility.
 - Use portable lighting in dark work areas.
 - Keep light fixtures clean and unobstructed.
- ⇒ **Inspect and Maintain Housekeeping Standards**
 - Conduct regular housekeeping inspections.
 - Encourage workers to report hazards immediately.
 - Reward good housekeeping practices to reinforce positive behavior.
